**ANNOUNCING THE PROGRAM OF ACTIVITIES OF THE STUDENTS  
ASSISTANCE COMMITTEE FOR COMMUNITY  
DEVELOPMENT FOR SY 1999 2000**

1 The Students Assistance Committee for Community Development (SAC CD) is a DECS supervised agency that encourages college students and instructors to develop the value of concern for their community and to actively engage in community development activities throughout the year and in a summer practicum during the summer recess. The culminating activity is a national evaluation seminar in Teachers Camp Baguio City every June 1-5.


2 Every year SAC CD sponsors leadership seminars in each province. School officials in public and private institutions, especially those in depressed provinces are urged to send student delegates to these seminars and to organize a Youth Community Service Club in their schools who can work on community projects throughout the year. During the summer recess provincial councils are urged to work in a barrio immersion project.

3 The SAC CD extends financial assistance to these seminars. No registration fee is required. Transportation expenses may be charged against school funds subject to its availability and the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

4 SAC CD also gives scholarships to deserving graduating members of the Youth Community Service Clubs (YCSCL).

5 Posters, flyers and leaflets will be provided upon request. For other details interested parties may inquire from or visit the SAC CD Office, Room 101, Dorm B, Philippine Sports Commission Complex, Meralco Avenue, Pasig City.
