4 A conference fee of Three Thousand, Nine Hundred Ninety Pesos (P3 990 00) will be charged each student participant and each teacher delegate to cover expenses for board and lodging, conference materials souvenir program and other training expenses Transportation to and from the conference site is NOT included

5 Student delegates will undergo make up classes to cover lessons missed for the whole duration of the activity Likewise teachers may be allowed to participate on official time only and provided appropriate arrangements are made for make up classes

GUIDELINES

***ELIGIBILITY** The annual convention is open to students of public and private secondary schools nationwide. Schools are advised to send their top students consisting of student council officers, school paper editors, members of the honor roll and other officers of the school organizations. Aside from leadership and academic qualifications each delegate must be of good moral character and excellent health condition. Person(s) with Rheumatic Heart ailment are advised not to attend unless certified by Family Physician as fit to attend the convention.

***CONFERENCE FEE** The conference fee for this six-day activity is **Three Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety Pesos (P 3,990.00)** for each student and teacher delegate. This fee is inclusive of board and lodging, PMA tour/interaction, Y2K Crash Course, conference materials, souvenir program and other training expenses. Transportation expenses to and from the conference site is **NOT** included.

***DEADLINE** Interested parties must have their reservations either by phone, fax, e-mail or by coming personally, at the CMIL Secretariat located at #23 Mearalin St. Central District, Diliman, Quezon City with telefax no. 924-2297 and 435 0008 on or before October 12, 1999.

***ATTIRE** Delegates are required to wear formal Filipiniana attire during the opening and closing ceremonies. Since sports activities will be held, appropriate attire is desired. Please bring enough warm clothing considering the cool weather in Baguio City.

***ACCOMMODATIONS FOR THE CONVENTION**
The Teachers' Camp shall provide complete bedding including one blanket and one pillow per person. Delegates are advised to bring additional blankets and pillow if they wish.

LISTS OF ACTIVITIES

***OPENING CEREMONIES**
The Annual Convention will not be complete without the formal opening ceremonies which is usually graced by prominent personalities, particularly the keynote speaker.

***Y2K CRASH COURSE** CMIL believes in the power of information and the adoption of technology that will sustain effective communication. We have therefore endeavored to invite the Presidential Commission on Y2K Compliance in order to avert possible computer catastrophe as we enter the millennium year—2000. A Crash Course on Y2K will certainly help disseminate pertinent information and demonstrate our capability to confront the so-called millennium bug.

***COMMISSION DISCUSSIONS** Delegates are grouped into different commissions to engage in group dynamic sessions. Various topics related to the theme will be discussed. Leadership-training values formation and personal interaction modules will be prepared for the benefit of the delegates.

***PMA INTERACTION** CMIL advocacy for peace involves inter-action with academic and learning institutions. For this particular event, we have chosen the Philippine Military Academy (PMA) for a group inter-action with the delegates in order to share individual aspirations, impressions and vision for a workable and lasting peace. The delegates will be brought to the premiere military campus - Fort Del Pilar, Baguio City.

***CONTESTS** There shall be contests by commission and by block. The best performing group will be given due recognition. Details will be discussed by the Facilitators of commissions and blocks during the conference proper.

***SPORTSFEST** The Sportsfest stresses friendly competition, teamwork and physical fitness. The delegates get to show off their skills and sportsmanship during this inter-block activity.

***TALENT VARIETY SHOW (TVS)** A Talent Variety Show among participating schools shall be held. In order to promote and preserve our rich cultural heritage, we are requesting the schools' presentation to be related to Philippine culture. Interested school delegations must prepare and rehearse from point of origin since no rehearsal time will be allotted during the convention. The CMIL reserves the right to screen performers. Performances will be given a maximum of ten (10) minutes. No individual performances.

***COMPETITIONS FOR EXCELLENCE (CFE)** The convention shall have the following contests: newswriting, pagsulat ng baita, monologue (english/ Filipino), t-shirt design, junk sculpture making contest, one-act play (english/ Filipino) and on-the-spot poster making contest. Only one student per delegation is allowed to participate in each contest. Participants are allowed to join only one contest. Contestants for the on-the-spot poster making contest should bring their own art materials. For the t-shirt design contest, the contestants should bring their own art materials. The t-shirt will be provided by the council. For the junk sculpture contest, the contestants should bring their own tools and equipment (e.g. glue, scissors) but the materials will also be provided by the council.

***SYMPOSIA** Part of the six-day activities are a series of symposiums. Prominent figures and experts will be invited to tackle subjects related to the theme. The delegates will be given a chance to interact with the guests during the open forum.

***WORKSHOPS** Several workshops shall be staged featuring renowned speakers on topics ranging from the Arts to Community Development.

***DISCO SOCIALS** After the six-day activities during the conference, it's time for the delegates to unwind. The delegates are treated to a night of fun and enjoyment. The Disco Socials will follow right after the Closing Ceremonies.
