**ADDRESSING 'SHORT TERM' HUNGER AMONG GRADE I PUPILS  
IN IDENTIFIED NUTRITIONALLY DEPRESSED SCHOOLS**

To Bureau/Center Directors  
Regional Directors  
Schools Division Superintendents

1 The Department of Education, Culture and Sports, through the Health and Nutrition Center, (HNC) shall intensify the Breakfast Feeding Program in selected schools nationwide, starting SY 1999 - 2000. The program aims to

- a address 'short-term' hunger, (a syndrome manifested in children who walk over long distance to go to school and gets hungry thus easily distracted and are inattentive and sleepy during class hours)
- b create awareness on the importance of eating breakfast and
- c improve learning capacities among children

2 The major activities to be undertaken are as follows

- Periodic health and nutritional assessment
- Deworming and treatment/referral of ailments
- Breakfast feeding with instant fortified noodles and other indigenous foods
- Monitoring of nutritional status and food consumption
- Evaluation after the feeding

3 Regional Directors, Schools Division Superintendents, District Supervisors and School Administrators are enjoined to give full support to the effective operationalization of the program, in collaboration with the parents, local officials, CO's, NGO's and other civic spirited individuals/groups in the community. Strategies to sustain the nutritional improvement among the feeding recipients may be indicated.

# **GUIDELINES FOR THE BREAKFAST FEEDING PROGRAM**

## **INTRODUCTION**

It has been observed that children who go to school on an empty stomach or those who cannot bring food to eat during recess time are easily distracted and have problems staying alert and concentrating on their lessons thus restraining them to benefit from the learning process. This is globally referred to as short term hunger.

The Breakfast Feeding Program responds to the elimination of short term hunger through the provision of breakfast in the schools. Its objectives are to improve the active learning capabilities of the children thru breakfast feeding. Specifically it will

- 1 provide nutritionally adequate breakfast to the pupils
- 2 create awareness on the importance of eating breakfast
- 3 utilize the feeding as an avenue to develop health and nutrition values and behavior

**Hereunder are the guidelines to operationalize the Breakfast Feeding Program**

## **I SELECTION OF SCHOOLS/RECIPIENTS**

The criteria for selection of schools are as follows:

- high prevalence of malnutrition
- schools with pupils coming from low income families
- priority will be given to areas where the children's houses are far from the school hence they have to walk one kilometer or more to reach the school
- schools situated in DDU areas
- schools with no current feeding program
- interest, support and cooperation of the school officials
- schools that can provide a safe and adequate place for the storage of the food commodities
- schools that can provide a weighing scale for the nutritional assessment
- willingness of the parents to assist in the preparation and serving of the food to the children

## **II FEEDING BENEFICIARIES**

The target beneficiaries shall be Grade I pupils in the selected schools.

## **III FEEDING ACTIVITY**

The feeding of beneficiaries shall be done during breakfast only between 7am to 8am inside the classroom. They will be served with hot instant fortified noodles or one serving of indigenous nutritious food cooked iron fortified rice daily for 120 feeding days. To have a

priority in the preparation of the breakfast meal using locally available materials the DECS standard recipe book shall be used. Parents shall be mobilized to assist in the feeding activities.

During the feeding emphasis is given on the development of desirable health habits such as washing the hands before and after eating, not talking when mouth is full, and sitting properly while eating. Likewise development of good table manners, courteous behavior and other characteristics like saying graces before and after meals, falling in line/waiting for one's turn and saying Please and Thank You when requesting for food to be passed shall be made. Advocacy on the importance of eating breakfast shall likewise be undertaken to ensure the attainment of the program's objectives.

Food production efforts shall be minimized to support the supplementary feeding.

#### **IV HEALTH AND NUTRITION ASSESSMENT OF BENEFICIARIES**

Physical examination and nutritional assessment (height and weight taking) of the Grade I pupils shall be conducted before the feeding. The classroom adviser shall measure the height and weight of the beneficiaries and such measurements shall be recorded in the Nutritional Status Form (BFP Form D). The second and succeeding weight measurements shall be done after 2 months and every other month thereafter while the height taking shall be done twice only (the 1<sup>st</sup> before the feeding and the second will be after the feeding). It is expected that the weighing scale used for the 1<sup>st</sup> weighing shall also be used for the succeeding measurements.

Pupils found with defects/ailments shall be given appropriate intervention or referral to the local health unit. Deworming of beneficiaries shall also be undertaken before the feeding and the number of dewormed pupils shall be recorded in BFP Form 1. These activities may be arranged/coordinated with the Division Health and Nutrition Section Staff or local barangay or Rural Health Unit (RHU). Classroom advisers shall note observations regarding the pupils' physical and mental condition.

#### **V ORIENTATION TRAINING FOR IMPLEMENTORS**

Before program operation, a one-day orientation training to each participating division shall be conducted by the Regional Health and Nutrition Unit to the Sr. Dentist, Nurse Coordinator, Nutrition/Health/FPP Supervisor, Property Custodian, Regional Accountant and Regional Auditor, Schools Division Superintendent, District Supervisor, Principals of participating schools, and Nurse District Feeding Program Coordinator to orient them on the objective and mechanics of the feeding program and their respective roles and responsibilities in the project to ensure its smooth implementation. However, orientation of adjacent divisions shall be lumped together to save on expenses. A written report on the orientation training should be submitted to the Health and Nutrition Center, Attention: Nutrition Division. Monitoring of the project implementation shall be done periodically by national, regional, and division coordinators.

#### **VI FOOD COMMODITIES**

##### **A Fortified Noodles**

If fortified noodles or iron fortified rice purchased at the DECS Central Office are utilized for breakfast feeding, the guidelines on the management of food commodities for the School Milk Project (DECS Memo No. 240/s/1999) shall be followed.
