1 The College of Social Sciences and Philosophy, University of the Philippines, will conduct a summer training program for social sciences/social studies teachers on April 10-14, 2000 at the Audio Visual Room of Palma Hall, UP Campus in Diliman, Quezon City and on April 24-27, 2000 in the UP College in Cebu City

2 The College regularly conducts these training programs every summer to assist teachers in schools and colleges in the country in updating their knowledge and information about their subject matter. The objectives of the summer training program are as follows:

- a to update participants on current researches in the social sciences and other social science related disciplines,
- b to enhance the formation of positive cultural values and awareness of social responsibility,
- c to present a well-rounded and relevant social science education that can encourage critical analysis, and
- d to appreciate the social, cultural, political and economic development in the Philippines and Asia through the study of history, Asian civilization, politics and governance.

3 A registration fee of Four Thousand Pesos (P4,000.00) shall be charged each participant. This shall cover the cost of conference kit, reference materials, lunch and snacks.

4 Social studies/social science teachers in public and private schools are enjoined to attend. Expenses relative to their attendance are chargeable against personal funds.
