THIRD NATIONAL TEACHERS CONGRESS ON VISUAL IMPAIRMENT

- The Department of Education, Culture and Sports through the Bureau of Elementary Education in coordination with the Resources for the Blind, Inc. (RBI), Christoffel Blindenmission, (CBM), International Council for Education of People with Visual Impairment (ICEVI), and Perkins School for the Blind will hold its Third National Teachers Congress on Visual Impairment at the Hollday Plaza, Cebu City on September 20-22, 2000. The theme of the Congress is "Reaching Out to Visually Impaired Students with Additional Disabilities".

GUIDELINES ON THE SELECTION OF THE 2000 OUTSTANDING SPECIAL EDUCATION TEACHERS FOR THE VISUALLY IMPAIRED

- A candidate must be a regular/permanent teacher actually teaching visually impaired children in a public school for at least 3 years; has met/undergone minimum requirements of 18 units in SPED (V.I.) or has undergone short term courses in SPED (VI) and has not been a recipient of any Regional/National award for special education teachers.
- The duly accomplished forms together with the requirements and supporting documents of the selected nominees must be submitted to the following offices on the dates indicated.

Division Office ------ on or before August 25, 2000 Regional Office ------ on or before August 31, 2000 Central Office ----- on or before Sept. 8, 2000

3. CRITERIA

I. PERSONAL QUALITIES AND CHARACTERS - Maximum --- 25 pts.

- A. Model of Morality and Integrity both in public and private life (sense of honesty, humility, diligence, dedication, good faith, courtesy, generosity, kindness, love and solicitude for visually impaired children)
 - Submit the names and address of 3 references consisting of nominee's current or previous supervisors, principals and former students with their feedbacks about the morality and integrity of the nominee
 - Certification from the Regional Legal Office that the nominee has not been found guilty of any administrative complaint or criminal charges --- 10 pts.

- Participation of visually impaired under the leadership of the nominee in community/barangay celebrations such as rondalla rendition, song fest, dance, drama, etc. - 2 pts.

SEARCH PROCEDURE:

1. Nomination

- a. Elementary and Secondary Levels
 - The nomination should be made by the principal. Each school catering to the VI children is entitled to only one nominee.
- b. Nomination form must be duly signed by both nominee and nominator.
- c. All supporting documents must be Certified by the Nominator and accompanied by the list of documents following the sequence in the Criteria for Evaluation.
- d. The nomination form and supporting documents must be submitted to the Division Office on or before August 25, 2000.

2. Evaluation of Nominations

- All nominations will be initially screened and evaluated by a preliminary board of judges from each Division.
- b. The name of the Division Winner together with his/her supporting papers must be submitted to the Regional Office on or before August 31, 2000.

- c. All Division winners will be interviewed by the Regional Board of Judges which will be held at the Regional Office on August 31, 2000.
- d. The Regional Board of Judges will select an awardee for the region. All decisions of the Board of Judges is final.
- e. The name of the Regional winner together with his/her supporting papers must be submitted to the Central Office, Special Education Division, Bureau of Elementary Education, Pasig City on or before September 8, 2000.

3. Final Selection

The National Board of Judges which will be selected by the Special Education Division, Bureau of Elementary Education, DECS. The Board will select the awardees for the Outstanding Special Education Teachers for the Visually Impaired in Year 2000.

 Awarding will be done during the 3rd National Teachers Congress on Visual Impairment on September 20-22, 2000.
