**INCLUSION OF THE UNESCO PEACE MANIFESTO 2000
IN APPROPRIATE CURRICULAR PROGRAMS**

To: Regional Directors
Schools Division/City Superintendents
Chairman, CHED

1. A UNESCO Peace Manifesto Mobilization Conference was held at the CREMDEC, Tapatap Hills, Cebu City last July 8, 2000.
