ONE-DAY ORIENTATION SEMINAR ON VALUES EDUCATION

To: Bureau Directors

- 1. The Philippine Teachers' Association for the Research of Principles (PTARP) will hold a One-Day Orientation Seminar on Values Education to be held on September 10, 2000 at the Jade Valley, 39 Scout Torillo, corner Timog Avenue, Quezon City.
- 2. The theme of the seminar is "Reengineering the Values Education Program in the Philippines Through Inter-Faith Liberalism and Ecumenism: the Key to Spiritual Renaissance, National Solidarity and Prosperity".
- 3. The objectives of the seminar are to:
 - familiarize school administrators and supervisors on the true philosophy, mission and goals of the Unification Movement in the Philippines;
 - b. orient the participants on the various organizations affiliated with the movement like the PTARP, Collegiate Association for the Research of Principle (CARP), High School Association for the Research of Principle (HARP), PWPA, etc. particularly their respective program of activities in support of the goals of the movement; and
 - c. explore ways and means in which the academic community and the PTARP could collaboratively undertake to strengthen and expand the Moral Recovery Program of the government through values education.
- 4. The seminar is intended for top and middle level school administrators at the regional, provincial and district levels. Enclosed is the Tentative Program of Activities.
- 5. A registration fee of Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00) will be charged each of the limited number of selected participants on a first-come, first-served basis to cover expenses for meals, snacks, accommodation and seminar materials. Participants from the public schools are allowed to attend on official time only. Those coming from private institutions shall make financial arrangements with their respective institutions/schools.
