ANNUAL TRAINING PROGRAM FOR SOCIAL STUDIES TEACHERS

1. The College of Social Sciences and Philosophy, University of the Philippines, will conduct its annual training program for Social Studies teachers on April 23-27, 2001 at the Audio-Visual Room, Palma Hall 207, Diliman, Quezon City.
