#### 2001 SUMMER TRAINING PROGRAM ON VISUAL IMPAIRMENT

1. The Bureaus of Elementary and Secondary Education in coordination with the funding agencies are sponsoring Training Program for Teachers of the Visually Impaired at the following schools/institutions:

Luzon Area

**Philippine Normal University** 

April 16-May 11, 2001

Taft Avenue, Manila

Visayas Area

Cebu State University

April 2-27, 2001

Cebu City

Mindanao Area

University of Southeastern Phil.

May 2-29, 2001

- 2. The program aims to upgrade competencies of teachers in providing educational services to visually impaired children in regular schools.
- 3. Priority participants/nominees in the three areas shall come from the identified regions/divisions/districts/schools where there is an urgent need for SPED teachers for the visually impaired (See Enclosures Nos. 1 A & B). Applicants shall be screened by the Regional Integrated Scholarship Committee based on the criteria set in Enclosure No. 2. Deadline for the submission of nominees to the region is on the 1<sup>st</sup> week of February 2001. Selected applicants are advised to make a collect call to Mr. Randy Weisser, Resources for the Blind, Inc. at tel no. 726-3021 for the interview before February 2001. The final list of nominees shall be forwarded to the Special Education Division, Bureau of Elementary Education not later than March 2001. The selected nominees shall be advised to submit all the documents listed in Enclosures Nos. 2 and 3 to the same office before the summer classes begin.
- 4. Selected teachers who were recipients of the DECS-RBI-PNU Summer Training Programs in Summers 1999 and 2000 are listed in Enclosures No. 4 A & B. Only those teachers who are actually providing educational services to the visually impaired students shall be given the opportunity to continue their training in Summer 2001.
- 5. Grantees under the training program at PNU shall be entitled to free tuition fee and a monthly stipend of Two Thousand Pesos (P2,000.00). Their traveling expenses to and from Manila shall be borne by the sponsoring agencies. They are advised to travel by sea or land. Trainees from NCR are entitled to free tuition fee and a monthly

stipend of One Thousand Pesos (P1,000.00). Similarly, the grantees at Cebu State University and University of Southeastern Philippines shall also be entitled to free tuition fees and stipend of Two Thousand Pesos (P2,000.00) including traveling expenses.

- 6. State colleges and universities as well as private institutions interested in offering undergraduate and graduate courses in special education or in providing services to children with special needs are encouraged to send their nominees directly to the Special Education Division, Bureau of Elementary Education, DECS Complex, Meralco Avenue, Pasig City with the required documents. Expenses for the training shall be charged to their agency funds. The nominees who will be joining the training shall pay their tuition fees to the Resources for the Blind, Inc. c/o Mr. Randy Weisser.
- 7. Immediate dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.

- 1. Is a Bachelor's degree holder for the elementary and secondary level.
- 2. Is actually teaching regular or SPED classes without training at the elementary or secondary level for at least three (3) years with Very Satisfactory performance.
- 3. Has grade point average of 2.0/85 in the undergraduate/graduate/post graduate study.
- 4. Is not more than 45 years OLD.
- 5. If married, is not pregnant or a nursing mother.
- 6. Has no administrative/criminal record.
- 7. Is physically fit, mentally healthy and registers positive attitude and commitment toward work, peers and students.
- 8. Is willing to conduct and/or assist in in-service training activities after scholarship.
- 9. Is willing to defray own expenses in case of delay of stipend/reimbursement of travel expenses.
- 10. Has not availed of any scholarship program for the past three (3) years.
- 11. Can adequately communicate in both English and Filipino.

Maintain at least the minimum standards for the training and that failure to do so would be sufficient ground for disqualification in the event of which he/she shall refund whatever amount has been paid by the government and Christoffel Blindenmission or the Resources for the Blind, Inc., in favor of his/her training;
- 3. Conduct himself/herself in such a manner as not to bring disgrace or dishonor to for the himself/herself, his/her school/agency and Christoffel Blindenmission or the Resources for the Blind, Inc.

- 4. Submit to the Bureau of Elementary Education/Bureau of Secondary Education at the end of the training a copy of his/her action plan;
- 5. Immediately report to his/her station and assume his/her functions upon the completion or termination of his/her training;
- 6. Organize SPED programs or classes for the visually impaired.
- 7. Shall serve his/her school/agency for at least two (2) years after each summer training;
- 8. Shall refund in full to his/her school/agency and to Christoffel Blindenmission or the Resources for the Blind, Inc. such sums of money as may have been defrayed by the Philippine government and/or sponsor if he/she fails to provide educational services to the visually impaired for at least two (2) years after each summer training; and
- 9. Shall live up to the terms and conditions of this grant.
