NATIONAL SPECIAL OLYMPIC GAMES

- 1. Recognizing the crucial role of sports in facilitating the integration of children with intellectual disabilities in school and in the society, the Special Olympics Foundation, Inc., in coordination with the Department of Education, Culture and Sports, will hold the National Special Olympic Games at Teachers Camp, Baguio City on March 5-9, 2001. It aims to provide them with excellent avenue to participate actively in sustainable sports.
- Participants are children with intellectual disabilities enrolled in SPED classes from the cities of Baguio, Manila (2 areas), Quezon City, Davao, Cebu, Iloilo, Bacolod, San Pablo and two areas from the Bicol Region who have joined in local and/or regional games. Each identified area is allowed a maximum number of 35 athletes, one (1) coordinator and seven (7) coaches/chaperons/SPED teachers. The superintendent or supervisor in-charge of Special Education per area is also invited. Areas unable to fill in the complete quota will have to communicate immediately so that other schools/divisions requesting for additional participants will be duly informed. The ratio of athlete to teacher/chaperon is 5:1.
- 3. Athletic events in this year's games include basketball, volleyball, soccer, bowling, shotput, long jump, track and field (50 m and 100 m dash), and relay (4×50 and 4×100). Participants are allowed to join in a maximum of 3 athletic events. Sports classification, number of participants, gender and ages for each event can be found in the enclosure.
- 4. Roundtrip transportation expenses from Manila to Baguio as well as board and lodging of participants will be shouldered by the Philippine Special Olympics Foundation, Inc. Divisions/schools will shoulder the transportation fare from their places of origin/stations to Manila and other incidental expenses charged to local funds and other NGO resources.
- 5. To facilitate identification of contestants and coaches/chaperons as well as preparation of sports facilities and equipment, please send/fax the following information on or before February 23, 2001.
 - a. Names of athlete contestants and their sports events;
 - b. Coaches/Chaperons
 - c. Total number, of delegates.
- 6.
