

2002 SEAMEO-JASPER FELLOWSHIP AWARD

1. INTRODUCTION

The SEAMEO-JASPER Fellowship was established under the SEAMEO-Canada Programme of Cooperation to commemorate the occasion of SEAMEO's Silver Anniversary on 30 November 1990. The Government of Canada awarded a grant to SEAMEO for the establishment of an endowment, the interest of which will be used to fund the fellowship for the benefit of citizens of SEAMEO Member Countries.

2. TYPE, NUMBER AND COMMITMENT OF THE FELLOWSHIP

One fellowship will be awarded for the year 2002, in the form of a *research grant*, to support the research fellow in the dissemination of his/her research, travel expenses to Canada (one month) and some SEAMEO Member Countries (20 days), with health/travel insurance.

3. QUALIFICATION OF APPLICANTS

The applicant must be a scientist, scholar or PhD holder, and a national of a SEAMEO Member Countries. He/she must have completed at least one research on the theme: *Children's Rights to Education* with sub themes: Child Abuse, Trafficking of Children, Minority and Ethnic Groups, and HIV/AIDS Infected Children. It must have been conducted during the last three years, and written in English.

4. SELECTION PROCESS

A Selection Committee composed of one member from Canada/Canadian Embassy in Bangkok, SEAMEO Secretariat Director and two well-known scholars and/or scientists from SEAMEO Member Countries will select eligible candidates. Selection shall be based on the research paper's scientific merit, writing style, its application and impact to SEAMEO Member Countries, and its interest and relevance to Canada.

5. **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

- a) Research submitted as master's thesis or doctoral dissertation will not be allowed to compete for the fellowship award.
- b) If the research has already been published, some new aspects/dimensions have to be added to the research before it can be submitted for the competition.
- c) For research entries with multiple authors, the following conditions shall be observed:
 - c.1 Only one person (the senior author) will be recognised;
 - c.2 A written consent will be given by the co-author(s) waiving any claim (on behalf of the senior author) to the award, in case the research is selected as winner; and
 - c.3 A statement indicating the percentage of responsibility for the research work will be provided by the senior author.

6. **APPLICATION AND DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION OF REQUIREMENTS**

The candidate must submit the completed application form; seven copies of not more than 20-page summary of the research (rationale, objectives, methodology, findings, conclusions, recommendations and references/bibliography); and one copy of the complete research paper. These requirements must reach SEAMEO Secretariat not later than **15 June 2002**.

1. A scientist, scholar or a PhD holder, not older than 50 years old
2. A citizen of any SEAMEO Member Country
3. Willing to comply with the requirements of the selected Programme for the next calendar year
4. English proficiency
5. The research or report written in English, should address the theme, be of good quality, worthy of presentation to an international audience and must have great impact to Southeast Asia's socio-economic development, as well as implications to Canada.
6. The research study should have been conducted within the last three years.

DEADLINE: 15 JUNE 2002

The candidate must submit:

1. Completed application form
2. Seven (7) copies of not more than 20 page summary of the research report
3. One (1) copy of complete research paper.
4. Medical certificate showing fitness to travel
