REGIONAL SEMINAR ON HERITAGE TOURISM MANAGEMENT

- 1. The SEAMEO Regional Center for Archaeology and Fine Arts (SPAFA) announces its call for nomination of participants to the Regional Seminar on Heritage Tourism Management to be held on May 20-22, 2002 at Siem Reap, Cambodia.
- 2. This will be conducted for Southeast Asia's professionals that include the heritage site managers, cultural administrators, tourism managers and consultants, tour operators, local leaders, academics, government officials, conservationists and interested individuals.
- 3. Nominations must be submitted to Dr. Eugenia Moraleda, Curriculum Development Division, Bureau of Secondary Education, 3rd floor, Bonifacio Building, Department of Education, Pasig City. Application form and the programme information are enclosed.
- 4. The objectives of the seminar are to:
 - gather together heritage site managers in Southeast Asia to provide a forum for discussion and exchanges of ideas;
 - b. build up a network of heritage site managers in Southeast Asia for further assistance and collaboration;
 - c. examine the upcoming/urgent issues in the management of heritage sites and tourism:
 - d. study the impact of tourism on heritage sites and how to exploit the sites to fully benefit both the local communities and tourism;
 - pursue ways to enhance the relationship between tourism management, the protection of heritage sites, the benefits for the local communities, and the satisfaction of the tourists; and
 - f. create a community-involved, grassroots management focus, which requires the involvement of local communities in collaboration with experts in the cultural heritage field.
- 5. Each participating member country is entitled to nominate one participant but two nominees could be included to facilitate proper selection. Formal nomination of official participants must be channeled to the SPAFA headquarters in Bangkok, Thailand through the office of the Secretary, DepEd.

- 6. Names of candidates must be received by SPAFA not later than April 18, 2002 to enable direct communication with the accepted participant(s) regarding travel arrangements.
- 7. Immediate dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.

Rationale

Heritage tourism describes a phenomenon of people traveling for the sake of experiencing and discovering either another culture or the cultural attractions of particular place, so tourism touches many people and places. As a result, this phenomenon is faced with the challenge of coping with additional pressure on infrastructure services, attractions, the local population and environment. The negative impacts of tourism can be significant for heritage sites. It has now become indispensable to seriously consider the management of heritage tourism on environmental, cultural and social issues as an important aspect of achieving sustainable heritage tourism.

Heritage tourism is a window to the culture of a country and thus must be treated with respect. Heritage Tourism management can indeed be made responsive to the needs of communities in such ways as the increase of employment and cultural products through tourism. However, many cases of heritage sites demonstrate that whereas non-management may be damaging, mismanagement is even worse.

In this seminar, government leaders, heritage sites managers, tourism managers, sociologists, entrepreneurs, local community leaders, academics, ecologists, etc. will have the opportunity to share and discuss current social concerns in the heritage tourism industry.
