ESSAY WRITING CONTEST

Rules and Regulations High School Category

- 4. The first place winners in the regional level eliminations shall compete in the finals which will be done at the Central Office of the Maritime Industry Authority in Manila. Cash prizes and plaques await the winners at the national level. The Maritime Regional Office concerned may determine what prizes can be made available for the regional level winners.
- 5. The theme for the essay shall be "WHAT CAN GOVERNMENT DO TO ENSURE THAT OUR SHIPS AND OUR SEAS ARE SAFE, CLEAN AND SECURE?"
- 6. The essay shall not be less than 500 words.
- 7. The essay shall be printed double-spaced in white legal bond paper with appropriate margins.
- 8. Only one entry per student shall be allowed.
- 9. Schools (high schools) may submit as many entries as possible.
- 10. Each entry must be officially endorsed by the High School Principal.
- 11. Deadline for submission of entries for the elimination round to the Maritime Regional Office concerned is September 07, 2003.
- 12. The first place winning essay-entries from the maritime regional offices must be received at the MARINA Central Office in Manila not later than **September 22, 2003** for the final screening.
- 13. The winners for the final round shall be announced not later than 30 September 2003.

National Maritime Week 2003 ESSAY WRITING CONTEST CRITERIA FOR JUDGING

The essays will be judged using the following criteria:

• Creativity/Originality/Innovativeness (15%)

The essay will be judged on the creativity and originality of the ideas for how government can ensure that our ships and our seas clean, safe and secure.

Comprehension (25%)

The essay will be judged on how comprehensive it is in terms of supporting the main points and conclusions. It must develop the main points completely and thoroughly. Using details, giving concrete examples, reasons and/or citations will add to the strength of the essay. The essay will be evaluated based on the consistency of the case on how government can ensure that our ships and our seas are clean, safe and secure.

Clarity of Expression (20%)

The essay will be judged on how clear the points are expressed. The essay must avoid ambiguity or vagueness, clichés, wordiness and repetitious and awkward word choices. It must exhibit appropriate use of words with respect to denotation and connotation. It must make pronouns refer dearly to the appropriate referents.

Organization/Theme Structure (20%)

The essay will be judged on how well it is organized in a logical way to support the subject matter or the theme. It must respond or adhere to the theme or the controlling idea. It must develop ideas without unnecessary repetition and provide explanations wherever they are necessary. It must display coherence within and between paragraphs.

Writing grammar, punctuation, spelling, style (20%)

The essay will be judged on the fundamentals of grammar, spelling. The essay should be mechanically sound and must be able to exhibit standard English usage.
