1. The Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization-Regional Center for Education in Science and Mathematics (SEAMEO-RECSAM) in Penang, Malaysia in coordination with the Bureau of Secondary Education, this Department, announces the regular courses for Fiscal Year 2004-2005.

4. Interested applicants may send their pertinent papers through proper channels to the Secretary (Attn.: Director, BSE). Applicants should have a degree in science or mathematics education, minimum teaching experience of at least five years and must not have availed of a similar training or scholarship program in the last two years. Nominees must be in excellent health and should not be more than fifty (50) years of age. He/She must also have a knowledge of basic computer application programs and good at spoken and written English in order to get the maximum benefit from the course.

5. Deadline for submission of nominations together with the nominees' transcript of records, performance ratings for the last three years, service record, medical certificate from a government hospital, certification of no pending administrative or criminal case, personal data sheet (CS Form 212), photocopy of baccalaureate diploma and endorsement from the Regional Director, shall be on March 30, 2004.
