2004 National Educators Congress

To :

- 1. The 2004 National Educators Congress for both public and private schools shall be held at the Bacolod Convention Center, Bacolod City on October 18-20, 2004. The theme of the Congress <u>"Building Literacy: A Collective Responsibility"</u> brings to focus the Department programs <u>"Every Child a Reader, Every Reader A Learner."</u>
- 2. The National Educators Congress aims to:
 - a. provide a platform for discussion of ways in which school reading programs can be revitalized:
 - b. validate reading standards for beginning readers;
 - c. share best practices on beginning reading, bridging reading gaps; enhancing reading skills and sustaining reading skills;
 - d. identify creative ways of expanding reading friendly environments like library hubs, reading stations, school libraries, etc. and
 - e. mobilize and strengthen reading networks
- 3. Each region is entitled to sixty (60) participants coming from both public and private schools. The target participants are Regional Directors **and/or** Assistant Regional Directors, Schools Division/City Superintendents (SDS) or Assistant Division/City Superintendents (ASDS) and selected Regional, Division and District Supervisors, School Principals, Teachers and Mobile Teachers from the Alternative Learning System. The Regional Directors are responsible for the mix of participants from both public and private schools of their regional delegation and for ensuring the participation of the expected number of participants from the region. It is hoped that 20% of the regional delegation will be composed of teachers.
- 4. Authorized to attend from the DepEd Central Office are Undersecretaries, Assistant Secretaries, Bureau Directors, Service and Center Directors, Heads of Units, Chiefs of Divisions and designated Congress Committee Chairs and Members.

- 5. The registration fees shall be FIVE THOUSAND PESOS (P5,000.00) for live-in participants and ONE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED PESOS (P1,500.00) for live-out participants chargeable to local funds or other available sources. This amount shall be used to cover expenses for the conference materials, six snacks, four breakfast meals, three lunches, three dinners, and accommodation (for live-in participant). Meals shall be served starting breakfast on October 18, 2004 and ending breakfast of October 21, 2004.
- 6. The Regional Directors are requested to submit the list of participants for preregistration. Pre-registration and payment in cash are encouraged. Check payments
 should be made payable to the "Educators Congress" as early as September 10, 2004.
 Personal checks of registrants from Metro Manila and provincial checks for areas with
 Central Bank clearing offices will be accepted. The registration fee with the
 corresponding accomplished registration form and a certification or letter from the
 Regional Director authorizing his/her attendance to the Congress should be submitted to
 Mrs. Olivia M. San Pablo, Chief Accountant, Accounting Division, Department of
 Education, Meralco Ave., Pasig City. Pre-registration will ensure the participant of a
 definite slot and a complete set of conference materials. For more information, please

- 7. For those who may not be able to pre-register, they may register at the Bacolod Convention Center on October 17, 2004 from 9:00 am 7:00 pm. It is important that all the prospective participants should register not later than October 17, 2004.
