DepED MEMORANDUM No. 196, s. 2005

CONFERENCE ON LEADERSHIP AND POWER IN EDUCATION: HONORING THOSE YOU LEAD

To: Regional Directors
Schools Division/City Superintendents
Heads, Public Elementary and Secondary Schools

- 1. In furtherance of the thrust of the Schools First Initiative (SFI) particularly for Local Governance in Education, it is essential that the public school heads are empowered with the necessary abilities to influence other people to move towards the attainment of success in every school and community.
- 2. More so, SFI involves other key sectors in the community in order to respond to the challenges of improving the delivery of quality of education in the areas. The success of SFI in every school and community can be determined by four (4) suggested areas such as:
 - a. involving education professionals in locality;
 - b. engaging parents and community leaders;
 - c. connecting with local government units and local political leaders; and
 - d. harnessing as far as possible local resources for educational excellence.
- 3. This Department has collaborated with the Center for Leadership and Change, Inc. (CLCI) and other supportive Loca: Government Units (LGUs) in Metro Manila in the conduct of a one-day Conference on Leadership and Power in Education: Honoring Those You Lead on July 27, 2005 at the Valle Verde Country Club, Pasig City among public/private school administrators. The activity which targets about 1,000 leaders in education will be introduced to new perspectives and strategies on:
 - a. the different dimensions of power and its uses;
 - b. how power diminishes or increases over time;
 - c. lessons on how leaders gain and lose power to influence; and
 - d. the discovery that ultimately "power lies within each of us".
- 4. Regional Directors and Division Superintendents are prompted to allow their principals, assistant principals, supervisors and assistant supervisors to attend this conference provided that it does not, in any way, violate DepED Order No. 9, s. 2005 entitled "Instituting Measures to Increase Engaged Time-on-Task and Ensuring Compliance Therewith. Registration fees for the conference may be charged to local funds or from the Local School Board Fund, subject to the allowable guidelines for this purpose. Enclosed is a flyer for the event. Interested parties are enjoined to contact their respective Division Superintendents' Office for inclusion in the list of participants.


