READING ASSOCIATION OF THE PHILIPPINES (RAP) ANNUAL SUMMER CONVENTION

To: Bureau Directors

- 1. The Reading Association of the Philippines (RAP), the national affiliate of the International Reading Association, in cooperation with the Department of Education (DepED), will hold its Annual Summer Convention on April 21-22, 2006 at the University of Asia and the Pacific, Ortigas Avenue, Pasig City. The theme of this convention is "Problems in Reading: Their Assessment and Intervention."
- 2. The two-day convention aims to:
 - a. increase the awareness of participants on the reading difficulties of the students and their causes; and
 - b. update the Reading teachers and educators on effective prevention and intervention strategies of reading problems.
- 3. Participants to this convention are school administrators, chairpersons/department heads, reading program coordinators and classroom teachers at all levels.
- 4. A registration fee of Two Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (PhP2,500.00) will be charged each participant to cover expenses for lunches, snacks, materials, certificate and other incidental expenses. Discounted rate on registration fee will be given to RAP members and early bird registrants. Participants outside of Metro Manila will make their own arrangements for accommodation. The program of activities including the rates for registration is enclosed. Since the venue's seating capacity is 350, the participants are encouraged to register early.
- 5. Travel expenses incident to attendance in the convention shall be charged against local funds subject to its availability and the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations. Participants coming from private schools shall make their own financial arrangements with their respective schools and/or sponsoring organizations.
