**2006 SPECIAL TRAINING FUND FOR DEPED**

To: Undersecretaries

Heads, Public Elementary and Secondary Schools

1. In line with the Philippine government's thrust to improve the quality of education, her Excellency President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo announced that the government is investing P581 Million as training fund for teachers to improve their competencies in Math, Science and English. This was announced during the inauguration of the National Educators Academy of the Philippines (NEAP) renovated building at Teachers Camp, Baguio City last April 17, 2006. The said fund is allotted for Summer and School Year 2006. The following are the President's directives for DepED regarding the use of funds:

- a. Train all high school teachers who are non-majors of Math, Science and English;
- b. Focus on Math, Science and English for this Summer and School Year 2006;
- c. Provide data on proficiency and competency of all teachers in Math, Science and English;
- d. Provide data that teachers have improved after training and intervention;
- e. Train as many teachers of DepED in the shortest time possible, at least 300,000; and
- f. Submit results to President Arroyo in October 2006.

2. In compliance with these directives, the Bureau of Secondary Education (BSE), Bureau of Elementary Education (BEE), Bureau of Alternative Learning System (BALS), National Educators Academy of the Philippines (NEAP), Teachers Education Council (TEC) and the National English Proficiency Program (NEPP) have submitted the different training programs and projects (list enclosed) to be conducted for Summer and SY 2006.

3. Region and division officials are requested to send specified participants for these different programs which begin this Summer and will continue for the 2006 School Year. Details for each program will be disseminated with individual DepED Memorandum for information on the dates and venue and other details. In the spirit of decentralization and school-based training management.

4. The 37,279 teachers who are trained in these programs are expected to train 10 of their co-teachers in the region, division and schools to ultimately upgrade the competencies of teachers and students in English, Science and Math. By October 2006 it is targetted that more than 370,000 will be trained.
