
REGIONAL TRAINING OF SCHOOL PAPER ADVISERS
AND CAMPUS JOURNALISTS

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Division/City Superintendents
Chiefs, Elementary Education and Secondary Education Divisions

1. The Department of Education (DepED) as mandated by RA No. 7079, also known as the Campus Journalism Act of 1991, through the Bureau of Elementary Education (BEE) and the Bureau of Secondary Education (BSE), announces the conduct of the Regional Training of School Paper Advisers/Campus Journalists across the country.
2. This training aims to further enhance the journalistic skills of teacher advisers/campus journalists.
3. The upgrading of the journalistic skills of teacher advisers and campus journalists will focus on the three (3) development areas namely: Copyreading, Sports Writing and Layouting categories, for English and Filipino to improve the performance level of students during the national level contests. These three (3) areas are considered priority development areas in the majority of the regions. However, options are given to the regions to select the categories based on their needs and interests. The regions shall submit to the Bureau of Elementary Education (BEE)/Bureau of Secondary Education (BSE) their training designs not later than June 16, 2006 based on the above mentioned areas.
4. The Regional Coordinator for Journalism, in coordination with the Regional School Paper Advisers Association (RSPAA), shall nominate the participants (teacher advisers and campus journalists) to said training specifically eight (8) advisers in the elementary level - four (4) English and four (4) Filipino, eight (8) journalists - four (4) English and four (4) Filipino and an equal participation in the secondary level for a total of thirty two (32) participants per division.
5. The Regional Training Program shall be subsidized by the Campus Journalism Funds (RA 7079) at the rate of Ten Thousand Pesos (PhP10,000.00) with an additional Six Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (PhP6,500.00) per division. Expenses of participants shall be charged against local journalism funds, while traveling expenses of monitors and training staff including incidental expenses shall be charged against the Campus Journalism Funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations. The Accounting Division, this Department, shall transfer the subsidy to the Regional Offices upon submission of a training matrix to BEE/BSE. A model training matrix is attached as Enclosure No. 1.
6. Teacher-advisers/journalists from the private schools are encouraged to participate as paying participants.

7. The schedule of the Regional Training for school paper advisers/campus journalists and the list of monitors are attached as Enclosure No. 2.

8. Immediate and wide dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.

- VI. Rationale

Recognizing the need to raise the level of the competence of school paper advisers in training the campus journalists on the different aspects of journalism, the Department of Education and the two national associations of school paper advisers (elementary and secondary) designed a training program to serve the purpose.

Based on the performance of the different regions for the past three years in the individual and group contests, each region is encouraged to address its specific areas of concern.

VII. Legal Basis

R.A. 7079, or the Campus Journalism Act of 1991, provides that "freedom of the press must be promoted even at the campus level" and mandates the Department of Education "to conduct training programs and press conferences on the institutional, divisional, regional and national levels culminating in the holding of the annual NSPC in coordination with the national organizations of school paper advisers."

These training and press conferences shall be subsidized from funds of RA 7079 and from the registration fees of the participants.

VIII. Objectives

At the end of the training program, the participants are expected to have:

1. achieved competence in the specific development areas of the region
2. identified the area of development in his/her division
3. formulated a set of criteria for the selection of participants/contestants in the different contest categories of his/her school
4. prepared an individual work plan for his/her school publication
