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
DepEd MEMORANDUM

ELEVENTH NATIONAL YOUTH CONGRESS

To: Bureau Directors

1. The Philippine Association of Secondary School Administrators (PASSA), announces the holding of its Eleventh National Youth Congress on July 16-19, 2006 at Teachers Camp, Baguio City. This year's theme is **"The Student Leader: Empowering Self, Empowering Many (Making Friendships, Building Learning)."**
2. The Congress seeks a) to develop a structure that would enable the student leadership to become a critical factor in the learning performance of schools; b) to create a network of learners in aid of learning towards the promotion of intellectual life. Focus of the congress is on English, Writing, Reading, Science, and Mathematics, which would be the venues for learners to be in aid of school learning.
3. Participants to this congress are the following: a) student academic leaders, freshmen-sophomores and junior-seniors, from select schools from the regions to be identified by the Bureau of Secondary Education; b) juniors and seniors from the other public and private high schools; and c) faculty advisers or moderators of academic clubs; and d) the joint boards of directors of the three federated organization of PASSA. They will manage the congress and act as resource persons for the workshops. Attendance to this congress shall be on official business.
4. A registration fee of Four Thousand One Hundred Pesos (Php 4,100.00) shall be charged each participant to cover board and lodging of participants, materials, and other related conference expenses. Meals shall be served from the supper of July 16 until breakfast of July 20. Members of the different committees, as well as the present PASSA officials and Board of Directors are authorized to travel two days before the congress. Traveling expenses and registration fee shall be charged against local funds or local school boards subject to its availability and the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
