THRUSTS AND ACTIVITIES FOR THE STUDENT TECHNOLOGISTS AND ENTREPRENEURS OF THE PHILIPPINES (STEP) FOR SCHOOL YEAR 2007-2008

To: Regional Directors
Schools Division/City Superintendents
Heads, Public and Private Elementary and Secondary Schools

- 1. The Department of Education (DepED), thru the Center for Students and Co-Curricular Affairs (CSCA), announces the Thrusts and the Synchronized Schedule of Activities for the Student Technologists and Entrepreneurs of the Philippines (STEP) for School Year 2007-2008. These thrusts and activities focus on the theme "STEP: Upgrading Skills, Improving Lives," which is also the theme of the STEP National Skills Development and Competition (NSDC) to be hosted by DepED Region XI and the DepED Division of Davao City on November 19-24, 2007.
- 2. For this School Year, STEP's thrusts put significant emphasis on the following:
 - a. organizing the school-based STEP Organization in both public and private elementary and secondary schools nationwide, including the Student Officers' Organizations and the Adviser Officers' Organizations in the division, regional and national levels, pursuant to its Constitution and By-Laws as provided by DepED Order No. 73, s. 2003;
 - b. implementing co-curricular skills development programs and other related activities of the Student Technologists and Entrepreneurs of the Philippines (STEP) Program, Technology and Livelihood Education (TLE), Technical-Vocational Education (TVE) and the Edukasyong Pantahanan at Pangkabuhayan (EPP);
 - c. upgrading skills of pupils/students in the various components of the TLE/TVE/EPP, including teachers' capability in handling life-skills development training of pupils/students;
 - d. implementing the awards program of the STEP;
 - e. conducting elementary and secondary skills development and competitions in the school, division, regional and national levels to be participated by both public and private schools;
 - f. increasing voluntary membership in both elementary and secondary levels and collection of membership fees to fund skills training, shop tools and attendance to the STEP competitions as provided by DepED Order No. 73, s. 2003; and,
 - g. establishing linkages with other government agencies, private organizations and the community.

- 3. The STEP aims to secure pupils and students a hopeful future and a significant place in the world of work by enhancing technical-vocational and entrepreneurial skills while developing leadership potentials and building desirable work values and character.
- 4. All Regional Directors, Schools Division/City Superintendents, Public Schools District Supervisors, School Principals/Heads and Teachers of Edukasyon Pantahanan at Pangkabuhayan (EPP), Technical-Vocational Education (TVE) and Technology and Livelihood Education (TLE) are tasked to support the activities and intensify the implementation, monitoring and evaluation of EPP/TLE programs which are integrated in STEP activities. TLE, TVE and EPP Regional and Division Education Supervisors are in-charge of coordinating and monitoring the STEP Program in their respective areas.
- 5. At the National Level, the Center for Students and Co-Curricular Affairs (CSCA) is in-charge of coordinating and monitoring the activities of the STEP.
