



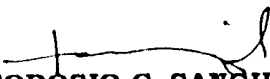

**PROPOSED ACTIVITIES FOR THE CLEAN AIR MONTH
CELEBRATION**

1. Conduct of Seminars, symposium and forum on various air-related concerns and activities;
2. Posting of air-related collaterals and dissemination of information materials;
3. Encouraging student leaders/organizations to include clean air programs and projects in their platforms;
4. Conduct of Smoke-free School Campaign;
5. Conduct of Smoke-free Malls Campaign;
6. Conduct of Exhibit and Fair about clean air initiatives;
7. Conduct of free and regular vehicle emission testing and conduct of preventive maintenance of vehicles for cleaner air;
8. Integration of compliance to emission standards under the Clean Air Act in the schools' policy in the issuance of car pass/stickers;
9. Inclusion of Clean Air messages in the school curriculum at all levels;
10. Inclusion of clean air policies in school regulations and programs;
11. Issuance of respective school memorandum or circular for its constituents (faculty, administrative staff, students) in adopting and supporting various clean air initiatives;
12. Working with Parents'-Teachers Association to conduct seminars for parents on vehicle engine maintenance and alternative fuels;
13. Active promotion of clean energy fuels or alternative fuels;
14. Encouragement of faculty and students to be involved in research projects for clean air;
15. Encouragement of parents, faculty members and students to organize carpooling;
16. Setting up of clean air information centers in school campuses;
17. Banning entry of smoke-belching vehicles (cars, jeepneys, tricycles, etc.) in institution's premises;
18. Designation of areas within the campus that are smoke-free;
19. Room-to-room campaign on clean air initiatives;
20. Carless Day campaign;
21. No smoking campaigns (inside taxi cabs, movie houses, food chains and/or restaurants);

 - Slogan
 - On the Spot Painting
 - Jingle
 - Essay
 - Logo or Sticker Design
