DepED MEMORANDUM No. 85 s. 2008

GUIDELINES FOR THE UTILIZATION OF DOWNLOADED DEPED CENTRAL OFFICE FUNDS AS SUPPORT FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF NATIONALLY IMPLEMENTED ELEMENTARY EDUCATION PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS

To: Regional Directors
Schools Division/City Superintendents
Heads, Public Elementary Schools

1. Aware of the DepED's mandate to provide quality education for all, the Bureau of Elementary Education (BEE) is downloading funds in the total amount of PhP42.5 million as assistance to the regions and divisions to reinforce the implementation of the following DepED-BEE's national priority programs:

## SUPPORTED PROGRAMS/PROJECTS

School-Based Management-APPES
Preschool Education
Programs for Children At Risk

- The downloaded funds are chargeable against the following:
  - a. The Preschool Funds, with a total amount of PhP25.5 Million, shall be charged against the 2007 Preschool Funds under GAA per RA No. 9401 with appropriation code A.III.e17 appropriated in the order specified in Enclosure no. 2;
  - b. The DepED-HRTD funds, with a total amount of PhP17 Million, shall be charged against DepED-2007 Training and Development funds.
- 3. The regions and divisions are enjoined to operationalize the enclosed guidelines in their implementation of the supported programs and projects to ensure the enhancement of the performance of the target schools and clientele. Disbursements of the funds are likewise, detailed in the enclosed guidelines.
- 4. For purposes of research and development, regions and divisions shall submit baseline and terminal project reports using the formats and dates specified in the enclosed implementing guidelines.

## GUIDELINES FOR THE UTILIZATION OF DOWNLOADED DEPED CENTRAL OFFICE FUNDS AS SUPPORT FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF NATIONALLY IMPLEMENTED ELEMENTARY EDUCATION PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS

- 1. The Department of Education, through the Bureau of Elementary Education, shall be downloading a total of \$\frac{1}{2}\$42.5 Million to the regions and divisions as funding support for the implementation of national priority programs and projects in elementary education. Specific allocation per division is found in enclosure 2.
- 2. The downloaded funds are chargeable against specific budget found below.
  - a. The Preschool Funds, with a total amount of ₽25.5 Million, shall be charged against the 2007 Preschool Funds under GAA per RA 9401 with appropriation code A.III.e.17.
  - b. The DepED-HRTD funds, with a total amount of ₽17 Million, shall be charged against DepED- 2007 Training and Development funds.
- 3. The support funds shall be utilized solely for the implementation of the priority programs and projects specified in the table below per project proposal submitted to the BEE:

SUPPORTED PROGRAMS/ PROJECTS
School-Based Management-APPES
Preschool Education
Programs for Children At Risk (Prog-CAR)

- 4. The downloaded funds should be used **exclusively** for any of the following activities:
  - a. School-Based Management-APPES and Program for Children At Risk (Prog-CAR)
    - Orientation/ Training of target clientele including supervisors, school heads, teachers and community
    - Procurement/ acquisition of learning materials to improve LEARNING in target schools
    - Actual evaluation to recommended schools for APPES and monitoring visits to targeted schools with Prog-CAR pupils
    - Technical assistance to be provided to divisions/ schools
  - b. Preschool Education
    - Orientation/ Training of daycare workers in 949 target areas
    - Actual monitoring of preschool classes
    - Conduct of school readiness assessment
    - Technical assistance to be provided to divisions/ schools and
    - Strategic planning and advocacy with stakeholders on the organization of preschool classes

- Regions and divisions shall be accountable for the judicious disbursement and allocation of downloaded funds and proper liquidation at own organizational level subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
- Since the fund sources are continuing appropriation from 2007, the funds should be utilized before the end of 2008. The liquidation of said funds, however, should be left at the discretion of the Regional Director but not to exceed the second quarter of 2009.
- 7. The BEE shall monitor the utilization of the funds and will **oblige** the regions and divisions to submit project reports using the attached enclosures 3-5 formats at these terminal dates:

Likewise, for reporting purposes, regions and divisions are enjoined to utilize the School Report Card format for presentation to stakeholders for support and accountability purposes.
