THE INSULAR LIFE GOLDEN EAGLE AWARD

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Division/City Superintendents
Heads, Public Secondary Schools

- 1. The Insular Golden Eagle Award was established to provide deserving students with college scholarship grants in order to help improve their lives and for the graduates to eventually contribute to shaping the country's future progress.
- 2. The program ended in 1993 to give way to another program of the foundation. The Insular Life Foundation, Inc. is bringing back the Insular Life Golden Eagle Award which consists of two programs: the Incentive program and the Scholarship Grant.
- 3. The top 800 public schools based on the National Achievement Test (NAT) 2006-2007, by cluster ranking, shall be invited to be part of the program.
- 4. The Award will be presented to the high school valedictorian during the graduation exercises. An officer of the Insular Life shall be invited to present the gold medal to the valedictorian.
- 5. The valedictorian together with the top 2 students of each Insular Life Golden Eagle Award participating high school can vie for a scholarship grant at the University of the Philippines, Diliman, provided that they pass the UP College Admission Test (UPCAT) and provided further that they are enrolled in the course Bachelor of Science in Education. The Insular Life Foundation shall provide ten (10) scholarship grants every year.
- 6. The benefits of the scholars are:
 - full tuition and miscellaneous fees for the 4-year course
 - book allowance of P3,000 per semester
 - stipend of P3,000 per month per semester
 - transportation allowance of P1,500 per month for 10 months
 - board and lodging allowance of P4,000 per month for 10 months

- 7. The grade requirement is 2.5 or higher in any given semester and no grade lower than 3.0. in any subject in any given semester.
- 8. After graduation, the scholars must work as teachers in any public school in the Philippines for at least 2 years.
