**2009 SACEDO YOUTH LEAD INTERNATIONAL LEADERSHIP CAMP**

1. The Sacedo Youth Lead, in coordination with DepED, announces the conduct of the 2009 International Leadership Camp on April 16-24, 2009 at the SYL Center, Purok Likod, Dumaguete City. This year's camp theme is "Reuniting the Youth of Today for a Safer and Better World" and will serve as selection camp for the 25 participants who will represent the Philippines in the World Leadership Congress in Washington, DC in July 2009.
2. The objectives of this activity are as follows:
  - a) to provide the youth the opportunity to re-examine, re-learn, and understand genuine values as applied to current leadership practices;
  - b) to study systems and structures that promotes values development and transformation; and
  - c) to formulate viable objectives that will translate national truths into specific plans that can be implemented on the local, provincial, national, and international levels.
3. In line with this, divisions may send one to two delegates to the said camp. Elementary and secondary school student leaders, out of school youth in different organizations, teachers handling student government are qualified to participate. Interested students and teachers from NGOs and private schools are also invited to participate. Program of activities and other details are in the attachments.
