GUIDELINES FOR THE UTILIZATION OF DOWNLOADED FUNDS FOR THE PRINTING AND DISTRIBUTION OF THE PHILIPPINE INFORMAL READING INVENTORY ASSESSMENT TOOLS FOR SY 2009-2010

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Division/City Superintendents
Heads, Public Elementary Schools

- 1. In support of the DepED's "Every Child A Reader Program" which aims to improve the academic performance of pupils and to make every Filipino child a reader, the Bureau of Elementary Education (BEE) is downloading funds in the total amount of Three Million Seven Hundred Eighteen Thousand Pesos (PhP3,718,000.00) for assistance to the regions and divisions for the printing and distribution of the Philippine Informal Reading Inventory (Phil-IRI) Assessment Tools.
- 2. The Phil-IRI project is part of the assessment component of ECARP. The Phil-IRI tools aim to assess the reading proficiency level of pupils in both English and Filipino languages in oral and silent reading. Results of Phil-IRI tests will show the reading profile of the pupils. Likewise, this will also provide basis for the implementation of appropriate intervention programs.
- 3. The downloaded funds should be used solely for the printing and distribution of Phil-IRI assessment tools to be used for school year 2009-2010. The downloaded funds is chargeable against the DepED OSEC-ECARP national funds.
- 4. The regions and divisions are enjoined to operationalize the enclosed guidelines in their implementation of the Phil-IRI activity. Likewise, they are accountable in the prompt submission of Phil-IRI profile/reports to the national office.

# GUIDELINES FOR THE UTILIZATION OF DOWNLOADED FUNDS FOR THE PRINTING AND DISTRIBUTION OF PHIL-IRI ASSESSMENT TOOLS

- 1. The Department of Education through the Bureau of Elementary Education, shall be downloading a total amount of *Three Million Seven Hundred Eighteen Thousand Pesos* (P3,718,000.00) for assistance to the regions and divisions for the printing and distribution of the Philippine Informal Reading Inventory (Phil-IRI) Assessment Tools. Specific allocation per division is found in enclosure 2.
- 2. The BEE shall provide one (1) master copy for the region and one (1) copy each to all the divisions. The master copy will be used for the reproduction of the 2009-2010 Phil-IRI tools using the downloaded funds. Funds allocation varies from one division to the other depending on the number of schools per division. The fund is exclusively for the printing of the new set of Phil-IRI Assessment Tools to be distributed to all schools in the division. The downloaded funds are chargeable against the DepED OSEC-ECARP national funds.
- 3. Regions and divisions shall be accountable for the disbursement of the downloaded funds and proper liquidation at their own organizational levels subject to the usual accounting and auditing requirements.
- 4. The BEE shall monitor the utilization of funds and will oblige the region for a consolidated regional report using the attached enclosure 3 format. It is reiterated that Phil-IRI reports/profile (report includes activities/interventions per reading level) for SY 2009-2010 shall be submitted in print and non-print (CD) format. Below are the scheduled dates of submission which should be strictly followed:

## Phil-IRI Profile/Report

• Pretest - September-October 2009

• Posttest - April-May 2010

5. For research purposes, regions and divisions are obliged to document best practices in their respective areas that provided impact on the improvement of pupil performance based on the Phil-IRI interventions for the last three years (SY 2006-2008). Narrative report on best practices shall be submitted to BEE for policy recommendations using the format in enclosure No. 4.
