#### 2009 NATIONAL CONFERENCE FOR SCIENCE EDUCATORS

To: Regional Directors
Schools Division/City Superintendents
Heads, Public and Private Elementary and Secondary Schools

- 1. The Science Club Advisers Association of the Philippines (SCAAP), in cooperation with the Department of Education-Center for Students and Co-Curricular Affairs (DepED-CSCA), Department of Science and Technology-Science Education Institute (DOST-SEI) and ABS-CBN-DZMM will conduct the **2009 National Conference for Science Educators** on May 11-15, 2009 at the Bohol Tropics Resort, Tagbilaran City, Bohol.
- 2. With the theme "Science and Technology Education: Meeting the Demands of Our Time" the conference seeks to achieve the following objectives:
  - a. enhance the knowledge, skills and attitudes of mentors utilizing breakthroughs in science and technology;
  - b. upgrade teaching performance of mentors to meet the demands in science and technology education;
  - c. explore new ideas and discoveries in science and technology;
  - d. adopt necessary values that focus on the application of new discoveries and breakthroughs; and
  - e. strengthen the cooperation and participation of science enthusiasts in worthwhile activities that benefit pupils and students.
- 3. Activities during the conference include plenary sessions, group dynamics, project studies, presentations and workshops.
- 4. Participants to the conference are the science teachers, science club advisers, master teachers, head teachers, department heads, principals, district supervisors, division supervisors, regional supervisors and science enthusiasts from the different public and private elementary and secondary schools nationwide.
- 5. A registration fee of Five Thousand Seven Hundred Pesos (PhP 5,700 00) shall be charged each participant to cover accommodation and meals from dinner of Day 0 until dinner of Day 3, training kits, certificates, reproduction of training collaterals, speakers' honoraria, t-shirt, bags and other incidental expenses of the program chargeable against local funds, local school board funds and non-DepED sources subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
- 6. Regional Directors, Schools Division Superintendents and School Principals are encouraged to send participants to the conference. The Regional Supervisor in-charge of the programs and projects in science shall undertake the coordination in the field offices pertaining to their respective delegation and representation during the conference.

- 7. Members of the SCAAP National Organizing Committee and DepED-CSCA Secretariat are allowed to travel two (2) days before the start of the conference. The Tentative Program of Activities and List of SCAAP National Executive Council Officers and DepED-CSCA Secretariat are enclosed.
