2010 NATIONAL SCHOOLS PRESS CONFERENCE (NSPC)

To: Undersecretaries

- 1. In line with the thrust to promote responsible and free journalism pursuant to the provisions of Section 2 of Republic Act No. 7079, this Department through the National Technical Working Groups from the Bureau of Elementary Education (BEE) and Bureau of Secondary Education (BSE) shall conduct the **2010 National Schools Press Conference (NSPC)** on February 22-26, 2010 in Tagum City, Davao del Norte, Region XI.
- 2. The conference theme "Campus Journalism as a Catalyst for Change: Achieving the MDGs by 2015 (Pampaaralang Pahayagan bilang Instrumento ng Pagbabago: Maisakatuparan ang MDGs ng 2015)" focuses on the 2015 Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). Each region is advised to craft a regional theme aligned with the national theme.
- 3. The conference aims to enable the participants to:
 - a. demonstrate understanding of the importance of MDGs by expressing it through varied journalistic forms and approaches;
 - b. demonstrate commitment to support MDGs by advocating and integrating them in related school community initiatives; and
 - c. enhance journalistic competence through healthy and friendly competitions such as individual, group, as well as radio broadcasting and scriptwriting contests.
- 4. The expected number of official delegates to the 2010 NSPC is 3,604. Each region shall send 212 official delegates. Early confirmation and registration of the regional delegation to the host region is encouraged by accomplishing the Confirmation Sheet in Enclosure No. 3. The first meal is dinner on Sunday, February 21, and the last meal is breakfast on Saturday, February 27, 2010.
- 5. The activities during the 2010 NSPC include the following: a) awarding of group contests winners; b) conduct and awarding of individual contests and radio broadcasting and scriptwriting; c) concurrent sessions; d) non contestants activities; e) awarding of the national outstanding School Paper Advisers (SPAs) and Campus Journalists (CJs) among others. See Enclosure No. 2 for 2010 NSPC Contests.
- 6. In preparation for the global "Stand Up, Take Action (SUTA)" activities, the National Orientation Workshop on the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) for the Regional Coordinators of Schools Press Conference (SPC) shall be held on September 14-16, 2009, Marikina Hotel and Convention Center, Marikina City. Traveling expenses of the participants shall be charged to local, or regional campus journalism funds, subject to usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

- 7. The global mobilization initiative designed to coincide with the "Stand Up, Take Action (SUTA)" against Poverty and for the MDGs activities shall be part of the **Regional Schools Press Conference (RSPC).** The conduct of RSPC will be spearheaded by the National Capital Region (NCR) to be held on October 16-18, 2009. Likewise, other regions, which are ready may conduct their RSPC on this date.
- 8. January 15, 2010, 5:00 p.m. (strictly no extension) is the deadline for submission of regional winning results (in soft and hard copies) of the contests mentioned in Item 5. Winning entries of school papers (Brackets A and B) should bear the name of the school, school address, division, and region; otherwise they shall be disqualified.
- 9. RA 7079 earmarks a subsidy of Two Million Five Hundred Thousand Pesos (PhP2,500,000.00) to RO XI, the host region for the conduct of the 2010 NSPC such as payment of trophies, certificates, supplies and materials, honoraria, board and lodging of evaluators, judges and facilitators.
- 10. Each participant shall pay a registration fee of Four Thousand Pesos (PhP4,000.00) to cover board and lodging, kits and other materials. This fee shall be charged to local funds, school MOOE, or school campus journalism funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations. Participants from private schools can make arrangement with their administrators, or source other means of funding. Advanced payment in cheques shall be addressed to DepED RO XI. Upon registration, cash payment is encouraged.
- 11. The conduct of the SY 2009-2010 Major Activities for the Development of Campus Journalism listed in Enclosure No. 1, and the release of funds are hereby authorized. Expenses relative to the conduct of these activities shall be charged against OSEC Project funds or Development of Campus Journalism, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
