SCHOOL FURNITURE ACQUISITION PROGRAM PRIORITIES

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Chiefs of Services and Heads of Units
Schools Superintendents
Vocational School Superintendents/Administrators

1. The total production of school furniture under the Economic Support Fund (ESF) Project and the PRODED Project from 1984 to 1986 is estimated to benefit 1,560,588 pupils or 17.5 percent of the enrollment in 1986-87.
2. It is likely that shortfalls in school desks exceed the projected/programmed production of the present ESF and PRODED projects.
3. To enable the Ministry to equitably distribute school desks that are manufactured each year, district supervisors should submit an annual priority list of only the most needy schools under their jurisdiction, indicating for each school the total primary and total intermediate enrollments and the corresponding shortfalls in the primary and intermediate grades.
4. The office of the schools superintendent shall collate the priority lists of their district supervisors and submit to the office of the regional director a division priority list. In turn, the regional director shall prepare and submit the regional priority list to the Ministry, care of the Planning Service.
5. The priority list for teachers' tables and chairs, blackboards, and other school furniture shall follow the same reporting procedure. However, the needs of each school district shall indicate the shortfall for each school furniture item in relation to the total number of classrooms in the school district.
6. The priority lists for school furniture for SY 1984-85 should be received at the Office of Planning Service not later than October 3, 1984. The priority list for school year 1985-86 should be submitted before December 3, 1984. The priority lists for 1986-87 shall be submitted on the first Monday of December 1985.
7. The implementing agencies of the school furniture program shall be furnished copies of the report to be used in the regional allocation of school furniture.

8. Regional directors are herewith advised to exercise control over the distribution of school desks, teachers' tables and chairs, under the ESF and PRODED projects so that the most needy will be given priority. It is expected that the annual total shortfall of the schools in proposed priority schedules in each region will not exceed five percent (5%) of the total elementary school enrolment of the region.
