Dear Sir:

On September 22, 1988, the Supreme Court issued Administrative Circular No. 4 to all trial courts in the Philippines on the matter of "Expeditious Disposition of Cases". The Circular directs the parties to a suit to agree on "(a) the number of witnesses to be presented; (b) the approximate number of hours that will be required by them for the presentation of their respective evidence; and (c) the specific trial dates needed to complete evidence presentation by all parties which must be within period of three (3) months from the first day of trial". The Circular also requires each party "to complete the presentation of his evidence within the trial dates assigned to him" and that "after the lapse of said dates, the party is deemed to have completed his evidence."

In anticipation of the implementation of said Circular and to enable this Office to fully protect the interest of the Government and/or its agencies and/or officials involved in a suit, please be informed that henceforth any request to file a complaint or petition should be accompanied with a memorandum of evidence; certified or authentic copies of documentary evidence; list of prospective witnesses with their present addresses and a summary of their expected testimony or their affidavits, and a statement that they are available. A request to defend your Office and/or its officials should similarly be accompanied by our aforementioned requirements. Unless there is full cooperation in this regard, this Office cannot possibly extend out-right, full and effective legal assistance.
