DECS ORDER

KABAYANI 100

1. Regional Directors,
Schools Superintendents,
Municipal, District and Private Elementary
and Secondary Schools.
2. The Department of Education, Culture and Sports in coordination with the National Commission on Savings, Philippine Postal Savings Banks, and the National Centennial Commission is launching the KABAYANI 100 project in all elementary and secondary schools nationwide.
3. The KABAYANI 100 is in compliance with the national savings consciousness program launched by the government through Executive Order No. 364, which created the National Commission on Savings.
4. The Kabayani 100 is a national project spearheaded by the KABAYANI Club, the national youth organization organized by Department of Education, Culture and Sports, (DECS) and Philippine Youth Development Academy (PYDA) under the KNOW, CLUB, HERDES PROGRAM sponsored by Senator Orlando Mercado under the National Centennial Celebration. The KABAYANI Club hopes to encourage the active participation of all elementary and high school students nationwide in the campaign for savings consciousness and to actively participate in savings through the 100 status of a bank depositor through an initial deposit of 100.00.
5. The project aims to:
 - a. Develop among the youth, especially among the members of the KABAYANI Club an awareness of the vital role of savings to economic development;

- b. Generate a greater awareness among the youth in their role in capital formation by encouraging them to save in banks and in other financial intermediaries;
 - c. Instill in the minds of the youth the importance of savings for sustained economic development through continuing nationwide informational, educational and communication campaign; and
 - d. Recognize and award the outstanding implementors of the program.
5. The active participation of all in-school youth in the Thrift Stamp Savings program and in saving in banks regularly shall be accredited to the three pillars of including the *Kakabayan*, *Makatao* and *Makakalikasan* Pillars of the *KABAYARI* *Sagay* Cards.
 6. The *KABAYARI* 100 project will be participated in by all members of the *KABAYARI* club and as well as all the other elementary and secondary students/pupils in the school who may register as new members.
 7. The implementing guidelines and project timetable for the guidance of all concerned are enclosed.
 8. All Regional Directors and School Division Superintendents are enjoined to assign the HEKASO Subject Supervisor and teachers to designate as full time as *KABAYARI* 100 coordinator of the school, district, division and regional levels.
 9. Immediate and wide dissemination of this Order is desired.

FUND RAISING PROJECTS FOR CHILDREN:

A. 3Rs Day (November 2-3 or December 1-2, 1997 suggested date)

Proclamation of the Annual Clean-Up Day - Day where all household in the Philippines will bring out their discarded materials and donate them to their favorite youth organizations or charities for pick-up. This may be brought out of the house for others who may find some use of it. The materials may be collected for recycling, reusing, repair and repaired for use in the home or in the school for instructional purposes. This requires an Executive Order or Presidential Proclamation to facilitate this. Whatever amount can be derived by children can be used for their savings.

The KOSBYANT Club in the different schools will spearhead this project with all the other youth organization involve like the boy and girl scouts of the Philippines, the student government, the Office Club and the Youth Entrepreneurs Club, etc.

B. The War on Waste Campaign

Under War on Waste (WOW) programs of DECS, the KAPAYANI CLUB members shall be encouraged to save and collect newspapers, bottles, tin, and other old but usable materials like usable secondhand materials, pieces of old clothes, furniture, appliances, etc., which can be sold or repaired and reused in the school or in the home.

At least a year sale of projects made out of discarded or recycled secondary resource materials like paper mache, jars, flower, baskets, jewelry, dolls, etc. will be sold by the school and students/parents through a school bazaar. The sale of their projects or the proceeds of whatever will be earned by them will be deposited in the PPSB by buying 1000P stamps which shall serve as initial savings deposits. An initial saving deposit of 20.00 shall be accepted by the Philippine Postal Savings Bank or any other banks during the period upon special authority from the National Savings Commission.

C. Evaluation

Evaluation of the participation of each school will be measured by the percentage of pupils to the total number of student population. This will be done four (4) times a year. The school with the highest percentage of participants will be adjudged winner for the district, division, regional and national level competition.

Moreover, the National Savings Commission and Philippine Postal Savings Bank have offered additional prizes for various categories.
