**ORGANIZATION OF PRESCHOOL CLASSES UNDER THE PRESCHOOL  
SERVICE CONTRACTING SCHEME SY 1999-2000**

To: 1. Regional Directors  
2. Schools Superintendents

(1) Preschool Service Contracting as an alternative delivery system aims to provide preschool experiences to prospective Grade 1 children in 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> class municipalities, urban poor communities and relocation areas.

(2) The program which was piloted in SY 1997-1998 for a period of 6 months has organized 1,565 classes. In SY 1998-1999, 1,860 classes were organized. The program provided preschool experiences to children in disadvantaged areas whose parents could not afford to pay for such services. Results revealed that children who underwent the said program had a smoother transition from home to formal schooling. Children have developed their self-confidence and their preparedness to learn was evident.

(3) The program will be on its third year of implementation this SY 1999-2000. All regions/divisions are requested to submit the list of prospective Grade 1 children for next school year in 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> class municipalities, urban poor communities and relocation areas. These are the children who are not accommodated in any school-based preschool, day care center or learning institution. Private preschools and non government organizations (NGOs) will be contracted as service providers.

4. Enclosed are the Guidelines for the Organization of Classes under the Preschool Service Contracting Scheme which should be strictly followed.

5. Immediate and wide dissemination of this Order is desired.

## **GUIDELINES ON PRESCHOOL SERVICE CONTRACTING SCHEME**

1. Under the Preschool Service Contracting Scheme, preschool classes shall be organized in 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> class inter-district, urban poor communities and relocation areas starting October 1999 and will end in March, 2006.
2. Five-year old children who are in Grade One pupils in, chilagawan will be 6 years old in June 2000, will be enrolled.
3. The Preschool service proponents shall be contracted on the basis of the following:
  - Non-government organization (NGO) that is registered both in law, one government agency;
  - Financially capable and educationally oriented NGO;
  - Private schools that are registered with DCS;
4. The amount of P250/child/day shall be given to full time service contractor for a maximum of 25 pupils per class, for the salary of teachers, instructional materials and administrative costs.
5. In the case of small amounts to be paid to DCS school officials in connection with the preschool service contracting program.
6. A separate fund for monitoring supervision of preschool classes has been set aside for the purpose. Hence no amount from the preschool service contracting program shall be used to monitor/supervise said classes. Preschool monitoring funds shall be transferred to the regions which in turn will transfer them to the divisions, pro rata.

### **A. Responsibilities of Service Contracting Proponents**

1. Organize preschool classes with a maximum of 25 pupils per class and a minimum of 20.
2. Provide the following:
  1. salary of qualified preschool teachers at least P3,000 (menter) per school-classroom and days if possible;
  2. adequate, developmentally appropriate instructional materials (e.g., educational blocks, toys, storybooks, tape, writing materials, workbooks on the floor, etc.);
  3. basic school supplies - e.g., pencil, paper, crayon, art paper).
3. In cases where the Service Contractor is located in the poblacion, it may hire untrained or semi-trained volunteers, who are willing to conduct classes in 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> class inter-district, urban poor communities or relocation areas.

3. Submit a report on the following within the first month of classes:

4. Conduct continuous coordination with DPCS and the community with regard to the preschool program.

5. Submit an accomplishment report and liquidate funds received from DPCS for preschool services rendered within a month after classes have closed.

## 2. Responsibilities of DPCS:

### 1. Central Office:

- Transfer funds to DPCS RD for the payment of salaries at P250.00 child/month for a period of 6 months.
- Monitor the conduct of the program.

### 2. Regional Office:

- Submit to DPCS Central Office data on the classes' organized and names of Service Providers not later than November 30, 1997.
- Orient the teachers and administrators on the conduct of the Program.
- Monitor the conduct of preschool.
- Coordinate with Service Contract Proponent regarding preschool matters e.g. conduct of classes.
- Transfer funds to Division Office who will in turn pay the Service Providers.

### 3. Division Office:

- Assist in providing classroom facilities if Service Contracting Department cannot do so.
- Have a Memorandum of Agreement with Service Contracting Proponent (Division Level).
