### ORGANIZATION OF PRESCHOOL CLASSES UNDER THE PRESCHOOL SERVICE CONTRACTING SCHEME SY 2001 - 2002

- Preschool Service Contracting Scheme is an alternative delivery system which aims to provide preschool experiences to prospective Grade I children in fifth and sixth class municipalities, urban siums and relocation areas.
- 2. Data gathered from the 6-month pilot in SY 1992 - 1998 revealed that through the said program, children experienced a smoother transition from home to formal schooling. Children developed self-confidence and their preparedness to learn was evident.
- The program is now on its fifth year of implementation this October, SY 2001 - 2002. In view of this, all regions/divisions are requested to submit a list of enrollees who are prospective Grade 1 pupils next school year. These are the pupils who are not accommodated in any school-based preschools and day care centers in the 5th and 6th class municipalities. Private preschools and nongovernment organizations shall be contracted as service providers.
- For effective implementation of the Program, please refer to the Guidelines for the Organization of Classes.
- 5. Immediate and wide dissemination of this Order is desired.

#### **GUIDELINES ON PRESCHOOL SERVICE CONTRACTING SCHEME**

- 1. Under the Preschool Service Contracting Scheme, preschool classes shall be organized in 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> class municipalities, urban poor communities and relocation areas starting October, 2001 and shall end in March, 2002.
- 2. Five-year old children who are prospective Grade One pupils (i.e. children who will be 6 years old in June, 2002) will be enrolled.
- 3. The Preschool service proponent shall be contracted on the basis of the following:
  - ► Non-government organization (NGO) that is registered with at least one government agency
  - ► Financially capable and educationally oriented NGO
  - Private schools that are registered with DECS
- 4. The amount of P250/child/month shall be given in full to the service contractor for the salary of teachers, instructional materials and administrative cost. Classes shall have a maximum enrolment of 25 pupils.
- 5. In no case shall honoraria be paid to DECS school officials in connection with the preschool service contracting program.
- A separate fund for monitoring/supervision of preschool classes has been set aside for the purpose, hence, no amount from the preschool service contracting program shall be used to monitor/supervise said classes. Preschool monitoring/traveling funds shall be transferred to the regions which in turn shall transfer them to the divisions, pro rata.
- No payment shall be made to PTCA classes accommodated in the program.

# A. Responsibilities of Service Contracting Proponents

- 1. Organize preschool classes with a maximum of 25 pupils per class.
- 2. Provide the following:
  - a. salary of qualified preschool teachers of not less than P3,000/month
  - b. school/classroom facilities (if possible)

- adequate, developmentally appropriate instructional materials –
  e.g. educational blocks/toys, storybooks, taped
  songs/puzzles and 3 workbooks on the 3Rs.
- d. basic school supplies e.g. pencil, paper, crayon, art paper
- 3. Shall be capable of providing the workbooks and basic supplies to the pupils as soon as classes start in October even if funds are not yet released to the Regions.
- 4. May hire unemployed teacher graduates who are willing to conduct classes in fifth and sixth municipalities, urban poor communities or relocation areas.
- 5. Conduct continuous coordination with DECS and the community with regard to the preschool program.
- 6. Submit an accomplishment report and liquidate funds with the Division Office for preschool services rendered within a month after classes have closed.

## B. Responsibilities of DECS

### 1. Central Office

- Transfer funds to DECSRO for the payment of services at P250/child/month for a period of 6 months
- Monitor the conduct of the program

## Regional Office

- Submit to DECS Central Office data on the classes organized and names of Service Providers not later than November 30, 2001
- Orient the teachers and administrators on the conduct of the Program
- Monitor the conduct of the program.
- Coordinate with Service Contracting Proponent regarding preschool matters e.g. conduct of classes
- Transfer funds to Division Office on time who will in turn pay the Service Providers

### 2. Division Office

- Monitor the conduct of the program with the assistance of the principals
- Assist in providing classroom/facilities if Service Contracting Proponent cannot do so
- Have a Memorandum of Agreement with Service Contracting Proponents (Division Level)
- Submit Accomplishment Reports to the Regional Office
