INCLUSION OF THE OUT-OF-SCHOOL CHILDREN SIX TO FOURTEEN (6-14) YEARS OF AGE IN THE NFE ACCREDITATION AND EQUIVALENCY PROGRAM

- 1. The Nonformal Education Accreditation and Equivalency Program (NFE A&E) is an alternative learning system which is designed to provide an opportunity to the out-of-school youth and adults fifteen (15) years old and above to continue learning outside of the classroom and a chance to reenter the formal school system (Source: NFE A&E Manual of Operations, 1999)
- 2. Pursuant to RA 9155 (Governance of Basic Education Act of 2001) specifically IRR Sec. 1.3 (Purposes and Objectives), one of the primary objectives of Basic Education is:

"To establish schools and learning centers, and other school facilities where schoolchildren are able to learn a range of core competencies prescribed for elementary and high school programs or where the out-of-school youth and adult learners, are provided alternative learning programs and receive accreditation for at least the equivalent of an elementary or a high school education." In the spirit of this law, the NFE A&E Program shall now be offered:

- to out-of-school children aged six to fourteen (6-14) years;
- o through community learning centers, the schools or the home; and
- also as a home study program supervised by the school or a service provider.
- 3. Hence, the additional NFE A&E test qualifiers for elementary and secondary levels are all children aged 6-14 years who are:
 - drop-outs of the formal school system;
 - in the labor force;
 - street children;
 - o children of indigenous communities;
 - physically disadvantaged;
 - o living in areas of armed conflict; and &

- o are in educational institutions that offer curricula different from the Basic Education Curriculum (BEC).
- 4. It is understood that passers of the NFE A&E tests for elementary level shall be automatically accepted in 1st year High School, and those for secondary level shall be eligible to enter college or post-secondary education.
- 5. The NFE A&E field operations funds better known as Literacy Service Contracting Scheme (LSCS) and Learning Support Delivery System (LSDS) given to regional and division offices will also be used for this purpose.
- 6. This supersedes previous Orders which may be in conflict with the contents of this Order.
- 7. Immediate implementation of this Order and its dissemination to all concerned is directed.
