#### DECENTRALIZING MANAGEMENT OF THE STRENGTHENED TECHNICAL-VOCATIONAL EDUCATION PROGRAM (STVEP)

To: Undersecretaries and Assistant Secretaries

Bureau Directors Regional Directors

Secondary Education Division Chiefs
Regional TLE/Tech-Voc Supervisors

Principals/Heads of Public Technical-Vocational High Schools

- 1. One of the Department's goals is to equip the high school students with relevant skills through the Strengthened Technical-Vocational Education Program (STVEP) in order to prepare them for higher education, world of work and for entrepreneurship.
- 2. To realize that goal, the Tech-Voc High Schools (TVHSs) under the Department shall be strengthened by providing a competency-based curriculum and training, physical facilities, instructional materials, manpower requirement and other logistic support.
- 3. For this purpose and until further notice of the Office of the Secretary, TVHSs shall be directly supervised by their respective Regional Offices (ROs) cognizant of authority, responsibility and accountability vested on the TVH School Principals/Heads by R.A. 9155. ROs shall likewise provide TVHSs with adequate manpower including financial staff.
- 4. The ROs shall provide necessary support and guidance that will enable the TVHSs and the various community stakeholders to offer appropriate tech-voc courses based on community needs. The course offerings are aimed at equipping high school students with relevant and TESDA-certifiable skills matched with the right jobs and/or entrepreneurial opportunities present in their respective local communities as well as provide necessary foundation for further education and training.
- 5. The objective of this decentralization initiative is to further strengthen the Tech-Voc Education Program to be offered initially to 140 priority TVHSs for School Year (SY) 2007-2008. See Enclosure No. 1 for list of these priority TVHSs. These schools were short-listed from among the 261 existing TVHSs initially identified from among the public secondary schools nationwide. The remaining 121 TVHSs and other interested schools which signified their intention to implement the STVEP are also encouraged to adopt the same.
- 6. Consistent with the above intent and purpose, the Department is declaring a transitory moratorium on the strict adherence to the Implementing Guidelines, Minimum Standards and the Learning Competencies of the curriculum prescribed in DepEd Order No. 37, s. 2005, which defined the TVE as a regular curriculum built on the 2002 Basic Education Curriculum (BEC)

- 7. Nonetheless, the above-mentioned guidelines, standards and competencies shall constitute the **framework** for any review and/or evaluation of the course contents of the existing curriculum including any development of an enhanced curriculum for the proposed competency-based STVE program as well as its articulation with TESDA Training Regulations.
- 8. To strengthen the existing TVEP in the public secondary education system per DepEd Order 17, s. 2007, the Central Office Task Force on Technical-Vocational Education is mandated to provide policy support; curriculum; teachers and management trainings; infrastructure; facilities and instructional support; logistic plans and other relevant technical assistance; and to document good TVE practices in the region and benchmark the same internationally.
- 9. Effective SY 2007-2008, all regional offices (ROs) are enjoined to assist and capacitate TVHSs in implementing the STVEP. In particular, the regions shall be responsible for the following:
  - a. Establishing a comprehensive/updated database of all tech-voc high schools in their respective regions. TVHSs that continue to offer 1 or 2 years of post-secondary education courses (under the Department) per the Enabling Act/local government ordinance establishing said schools shall also receive the necessary guidance and logistic and instructional support;
  - b. Providing priority attention to the 140 priority TVHSs in terms of additional resources for capital expenditures and other technical assistance. For this purpose, it shall release all necessary funding support to TVHSs.
  - c. Monitoring the implementation of the STVEP in all the TVHSs from 1<sup>st</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> year levels. The understanding reached at the national level between the DepEd and TESDA for high school graduates includes the awarding of the national competency certification (NC Levels 1 and 2) to be issued by TESDA to those who will pass the competency assessment.
  - d. Requiring the TVHSs with additional time-on-task and/or additional lesson/training modules as may be appropriate to complete the requirements. Teachers and other personnel engaged on additional time-on-task shall receive appropriate compensation in the form of overtime pay, honoraria or service credits;
  - e. Transmitting to the Central Office TVE Task Force a Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) on the challenges faced and opportunities created in their respective regions. This report will be used to guide the policy decision makers towards a more decentralized management of the STVE program and will enable the National TVE Task Force Office to recognize new viable tech-voc initiatives and existing good practices of TVHSs. Enclosure 2 is the suggested standard format for the QPR;

- f. Providing resource persons/experts for the summative evaluation of this initiative to further decentralize the management of the STVEP from the national or central office to the regions beyond school year 2007-2008;
- g. Guiding the TVHSs on the next steps for a more meaningful partnership with and their respective community stakeholders; and
- h. Empowering the TVHSs to provide the students with skills training and job opportunities for themselves and for their respective families.
- 10. Additional specific guidelines, as agreed upon during the 2007 Consultation Workshop and the succeeding curriculum writing workshop, are provided in Annex A.
- 11. Immediate and wide dissemination of and compliance of this Order is directed.

#### ANNEX A OF THE DEPED ORDER NO. 48, S. 2007

## SPECIFIC GUIDELINES FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE STRENGTHENED TECHNICAL – VOCATIONAL EDUCATION PROGRAM (STVEP)

- 1. **General.** The following guidelines are issued to provide guidance to the 140 priority secondary tech-voc high schools (TVHSs), to the other remaining 121 TVHSs and other interested public secondary schools in the implementation of the Strengthened Technical Vocational Education Program (STVEP).
- 2. **Program Objectives.** The objectives of the program are as follows:
  - a. Provide high school graduates with opportunities to acquire certifiable vocational and technical skills that would allow broader options in pursuing their post-secondary career whether this is college education, short-term technical courses, entrepreneurship or apprenticeship leading to eventual formal employment;
  - b. Provide high school graduates with employable and entrepreneurial skills that will provide them with means and resources to support their postsecondary career as well as enabling them to support formal schooling opportunities for the younger siblings of the family;
  - c. Provide technical skills training to out-of-school youths who receive education through the 1) Alternative Learning System and 2) the Madrasah Education Program.
- 3. **Program Components.** The strengthening of TVHS shall include the following interventions:
  - a. Competency-Based Curriculum aligned to TESDA Training Regulations and Standards
  - b. Training for TVE and academic teachers, Heads/Principals/VSAs of TVHSs, Guidance Counselor and Regional Supervisors
  - c. Provision for Tools, Facilities and Equipment
  - d. Provision for Infrastructure Support that includes Repair, Rehabilitation and Construction of Workshop Buildings
  - e. Provision for Textbooks, Learning Manuals and Instructional Materials
  - f. Provision for Increased MOOE (per DepEd Order No. 24, s. 2007)
  - g. Provision for Additional Teacher Plantilla Items
  - h. Policy Support
  - i. Monitoring and Evaluation (M & E)
- 4. **Implementation Policies.** For the initial and full implementation of the program, all concerned shall observe the following policies, rules, and guidelines:

- a. **Student Coverage.** All secondary students from first year to fourth year that are enrolled in the 140 tech-voc schools and the additional schools who have signified their intention to implement the STVEP are deemed covered.
- b. **Certification.** All covered students shall be given skills trainings that will enable them to acquire TESDA certification with corresponding competencies in their field of specialization in levels I and II. A special catch-up program shall be designed for the second year, third and fourth year students to allow them to get the same certification. For this purpose, special classes providing for additional contact hours including but not limited to Saturday classes, shall be organized by the implementing tech-voc schools.
- c. **Curriculum.** Instruction in 18 priority tech-voc courses shall follow the new Competency-Based Curriculum jointly prepared by DEPED and TESDA. A separate guideline covering said curricula shall be issued later. Other remaining tech-voc courses not included in the 18 identified courses shall be subjected to competency-based curriculum development for SY 2008-2009.
- d. **Teachers Training and Certification.** All TVE teachers shall be provided trainings in the identified 18 tech-voc courses. These trainings shall include the acquisition of the technology, the teaching methodology and the opportunity to be assessed and certified by TESDA and other generally-accepted certifying bodies. It is the objective of this program to ensure that eventually, all TVE teachers possess at least NC II level of certification in their field of specialization.
- e. **Deployment of Additional Plantilla Items.** To improve the existing teacher to student ratio, there shall be two additional teacher plantilla items to be given to each of the 164 priority TVHSs. Said two teacher items shall also function as a Guidance Counselor and/or Laboratory Supervisor. These additional plantilla items and the existing plantilla items in these schools should not be re-aligned to other schools.
- f. **Hiring.** Hiring of teachers will be based on DepEd Order No. 4 s. 2007. Criteria will be based on the minimum standards for a vocational subject teacher outlined in Item G of the Implementing Guidelines of DepEd Order No. 37 s. 2005. Authority is hereby given to TVHSs to hire contractual teachers or instructors whose honoraria shall be charged against the local school MOOE.
- g. **Designation of School Heads.** School heads shall be designated based on existing guidelines. Additional management training on the operation and management of a TVE program shall be formulated and given to school heads in preparation for the full implementation of the program and for subsequently designated school heads.
- h. **Funding.** During its pilot implementation, the 140 priority TVHSs shall be provided support by the Central Office. For FY 2008, each school will follow the per capita MOOE allocation (P760/student in agricultural and fisheries schools and P 1,000/student in art and trades school) provided for in Section 4.2 of the DepEd Order No. 24, s. 2007 entitled "Budget Strategy of 2007 for the Basic Education Sector". Annual allocation for the increasing number of schools involved in the implementation will be

provided for by the Regional and Division Offices. School heads are encouraged to establish partnerships with the private sectors and industries through the Adopt-a-School Program to augment their logistical requirements during the pilot implementation and throughout the full implementation of the program. - i. **Income-Generating Project Fund Utilization.** Schools with existing income generating projects based on the tech-voc program shall be allowed to use the income as a revolving fund, subject to Special Provision Number 11 of the 2005 General Appropriations Act.
  - i. Income derived from the IGP shall be placed in a special account separate from the MOOE Funds. The special account shall be opened with an authorized government depository bank, preferably, the Land Bank of the Philippines. A separate account ledger shall be prepared by the school accountant for this account.
  - ii. Withdrawal from the account shall be through the joint signatures of the school head and the authorized representatives of the school with at least one duly elected student organization representative.
  - iii. The funds may be utilized to cover (i) expenses directly incurred in the said manufacturing and production activities, (ii) expenses necessary to cover student loans essential to support continued and sustained school-student projects or enterprises, and other instructional programs of the school and (iii) to augment scholarship support to students who are directly involved in the manufacturing and production programs of the schools.
  - iv. Pursuant to Section 11 of the Special Provision of GAA 2007, TVHSs which possess the technical capabilities shall be given preference in the manufacturing and fabrication of desks, furniture and equipment. Certification from TVHSs that they are not capable in producing the requirements of schools, divisions and higher offices of the DEPED must be first secured before any procurement from other sources can be pursued. Schools without any existing income generating projects are encouraged to explore opportunities to earn and must be given such opportunities by all DEPED schools and offices for their furniture and other equipment needs.
- 5. Classes. Classes are categorized as instructional classes and workshops. Instructional classroom-student ratio will follow the 1:45 targeted by the Department for SY 2007-2008. Workshop-student ratio may vary from the initial target of 1:25 to the ideal ratio of 1:16 to 1:10 depending on the subject being taught and availability of training instructor, training equipment and/or training materials. To improve further the teacher-student ratio, additional workshop instructors may be arranged by the schools out of volunteer-teachers from the private sector, retired licensed professionals (such as engineers and technicians), expert former OFWs and other similarly-situated experts, provided that they must be supervised by a DepEd TVE teacher at all times. Volunteers shall be provided with trainings on technology teaching methodology by and to be arranged with

TESDA as well as orientation on basic safety procedures being implemented by the school.

- 6. **On-the-Job Training**. Schools are encouraged to organize on-the-job training and apprenticeship programs, with both the government and the private sectors that can be part of the class schedule.
- 7. **Procurement**. Procurement of supplies and equipment shall follow the existing rules and regulations under RA 9184 including procurement of locally available. School heads are authorized to lead the procurement of locally available supplies and materials.
- 8. **Overall Program Supervision.** The overall supervision of the program during the pilot implementation phase is assigned to the Technical-Vocational Education Program Task Force (TVETF) being co-chaired by the Undersecretary and Assistant Secretary for Programs and Projects and co-led by Mr. Romeo Glenn B. Sumido, Jr. and Dir. Ricardo M. de Lumen.
- 9. Policy Review and Reporting Requirement. The policies and guidelines established will be reviewed every summer of each coming school year. Two (2) independent sets of implementation reports are expected: (1) School Implementation Report (SIR) from (a) the pilot schools for SY 2007 2008 and other interested TVHSs and general schools; and (b) all of the remaining 261 existing tech-voc high schools for SY 2008 2009; and (2) Regional Implementation Report (RIR) from the Regional Offices of that supervises the 261 tech-voc schools. These reports shall be submitted within twenty (20) working days after the end of each school year. The RIR shall be based on the reports of the Regional and Division Supervisors.
- 10. Other schools that elect to adopt these guidelines are encouraged to do so, upon recommendation of their respective Regional Offices and upon formal notice to the National TVE Task Force Office.
- 11 Those schools personally identified by the Secretary to be included to this STVE program are also covered.
