BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE PHILIPPINES EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 486

PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION AND COMPILATION OF HISTORICAL DATA REGARDING BARRIOS, TOWNS, CITIES, AND PROVINCES

WHEREAS, the manuscripts, books and other publications forming the collections of the National Library were almost entirely destroyed during the battle for the liberation of the City of Manila from the Japanese;

WHEREAS, among the documents destroyed were those manuscripts containing important data relating to the history and culture of our barrios, towns cities, and provinces—manuscripts which were collated and preserved by virtue of Executive Order Nos. 2 and 136, dated January 26, 1911, and January 3, 1938, respectively; and

WHEREAS, it is for our advancement that such data be regathered and brought up to date from time to time, to serve as a source of inspirations and guidance for our future generations, as well as source materials for historians, investigators and researchers;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ELPIDIO QUIRINO, President of the Philippines, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order;

That data on the history and culture of each barrio, town, city and province be collected and compiled;

That the history of each province be written;

That the Division Superintendent of Schools direct the collection of these data and the preparation of the manuscripts, using the outline appearing in the Appendix hereto, which is hereby made an integral part of this Order;

All agencies of the Government as well as private citizens in possession of any pertinent historical data in any form are hereby enjoined to extend their full cooperation to the Division Superintendents, District Supervisors, Principals and teachers entrusted with the execution of the Order.

Done in the City of Manila, this 7th day of December in the year of Our Lord, nineteen hundred and fifty-one, and of the Independence of the Philippines, the sixth.
