Maj. Gen. Fernando Mesa, National Capital Region Command (NCRCOM) chief, said the reinforcements were called not only because of the rallies but also because of reported plans by communist rebels to infiltrate the ranks of protesters

Police and military troops in Central Luzon were also placed on heightened alert and positioned at tollgates along the North Luzon Expressway to monitor possible mobilization of sectoral groups that will join the Makati rally
