GMA: WB pledges \$10-B standby fund for Asia

The World Bank has committed to initially provide \$10 billion to help establish a fund being readied by Southeast Asian nations – plus Japan, China and South Korea – to buy toxic debts and support banks in the region hit by the global financial crisis, President Arroyo said yesterday.

"The facility can be used to purchase what the bankers cal toxic assets and recapitalize troubled financial institution and private companies," she said in a speech during the cash taking of officials of the Union of Local Authorities or the Philippines (ULAP) at Malacanane.
