Speaking to reporters in Baguio City, Mrs. Arroyo said her administration was able to take steps to protect the economy early on from the global crisis.

The government's duty is to protect the people from food and to oil price shocks, and tempering a

inflation, she added.

Mrs. Arroyo said the Philippines was not seen by internation-

pines was not seen by international agencies as having a food problem during the rice crisis last year. "We can never predict anything

with certainty," she said.

"Two-thirds of the world is in recession, but not in the Philippines.

The important thing is we have to make sure we remain competitive." Mrs. Arroyo did not deliver her traditional Christmas message on television and on radio.

She also did not speak during the Rizal Day celebrations when she was expected to enumerate her administration's accomplishments for the year.

It was apparently the first time this happened under the Arroyo administration. – Paolo Romero
