## GMA wants zero political killings

President Arroyo yesterday ordered the Philippine National Police (PNP) to bring political and media kiliings down to zero amid fresh criticisms on the country's human rights situation.

of the PNP Academy in Silang, Cavite, she cited the reduction in crime rates, including bank robberies and kidnappings, in

robberies and kidnappings, in the country. "We must bring political killings to zero, including as-assinations of government officials and media personali-ties," Mrs. Arroyo said. She directed PNP chief Di-rector General Jesus Verzosa to give protection to Davao City-based broadcaster Elgin Dam-asco and investigate the death threats against him. Damasco, a broadcaster for dzDC Radio Mindanao Net-work (RMN), went on leave after receiving threats on his

work (RMN), went on leave after receiving threats on his mobile phone. He has report-ed extensively on the abduc-tion, rape and murder of Re-belyn Pitao, the daughter of local New People's Army leader Leoncio Pitao. He also outling suproted as

leader Leoncio Pitao. He also earlier reported on alleged military abuses. Uni-dentified men were reported by seen casing the RMN station. There were reports that Mrs. Arroyo might meet with Dam-asco when she arrives in Davao to address the national conference of local envergent officials

The New York-based Com-mittee to Protect Journalists earlier said the Philippines remains among the world's most dan-gettue places for gerous places for journalists, while the European Union Parliament had issued a resolu cern over the unex-plained killings in the country.

plained killings in the country. Earlier this month, a broadcast-er in Cagayan de Oro was shot and seriously wounded by unidentified men. Last year, sev-en journalists were assassinated.

en journalists were assassinated. Mrs. Arroyo told the new PNPA graduates that there is still a lot of work to do despite the achievements of their predecessors. "Our people have given you the rare opportunity to

rare opportunity to develop your rare potential. Go now and give back what you received by and give back what you received by keeping the people safe.
