man Anthony Golez said that the President would leave just before noon for her two-day official visit to Seoul. An official visit means that Filipino taxpayers are shouldering the

expenses for the trip.

Malacañang previously stated that the Department of Foreign Affairs and the President's security advisers had studied the implications of North Korea's recent nuclear and missile tests and determined that the President should push through with the trip.
